27-29 June 2017, Manchester, UK



The 25th year since the first meeting of ialeUK is an opportunity to reflect on the increasing importance of landscape ecology and its affect over the next 25 years.

Practical landscape projects have strengthened local communities, built a sense of place and enhanced the natural environment. Consideration of nature and culture increasingly supports landscape planning for environmental, social and economic sustainability.

Landscape and landscape characterization is now widely understood to encompass

urban, rural and marine. Landscape surveillance and monitoring increasingly understands heterogeneity and informs the development of spatial models and decision support tools. Landscape-scale conservation is the new mainstream with a realization that the wider landscape requires attention alongside protected areas and priority habitats. Landscape history has shaped current patterns of natural assets, and their structure and function provide ecosystem services we depend upon. Together with nature-based solutions, the link between urban, rural and seascape is recognized as a key factor for

enhanced resilience and human well-being. We look forward to welcoming participants from around the world who work with landscape and seascape, including natural and social scientists, landscape architects, planners, policy-makers, geographers and archaeologists. The conference will appeal to people working in research, policy and practice and will include plenty of opportunities for discussion and networking.

## French landscape ecology group: a new start

After several years of informal activity around meetings gathering 80 people every two years or so, French landscape ecologists have just created a new formal group. This group is part of the initiative launched in 2016 by the French Society of scientific Ecology (Société Française d'Ecologie SFE, [www.sfecologie.org/](http://www.sfecologie.org/)) to support structured actions within subdisciplines or around specific topics of scientific ecology. The landscape ecology group was officially launched in October 2016 during the SFE conference organized in Marseille. The first actions of the group were to create a website ([ecologie-paysages.sfecologie.org/](http://ecologie-paysages.sfecologie.org/)), to conduct a survey of landscape ecologists in France, to create a mailing list ([ecologie-paysages@sfecologie.org](mailto:ecologie-paysages@sfecologie.org)), and to organise bi-annual conferences.

The first conference of the group will take place in Toulouse from the 23rd to the 26th of October 2017 ([colloque.inra.fr/rep2017](http://colloque.inra.fr/rep2017)). At present, anyone interested in landscape ecology can become a member of the group by registering to the mailing list, without any obligation to become a member of SFE or EALE, although this is highly encouraged. Once the group gains momentum, relationships between the group and EALE will need to be reconsidered and may become more formal.


